# WORK ORDER AMENDMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- a) Except as herein modified, all terms and conditions of the cited original Work Order (as previously amended, if applicable) shall remain in full force and effect for the term of the Work Order as originally set forth in said Work Order.
- b) In accordance with the Master Agreement, which states that any amendments shall be valid only when expressed in writing and duly signed by the parties, the parties desire to amend the cited Work Order as indicated.
- c) The Scope of Services attached to the cited Work Order may be modified as provided in any attachment to this Amendment, which will be incorporated by this reference.
- d) The CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR shall provide said services pursuant to this Amendment, the cited Work Order (as further amended, if applicable), its Attachments, and the cited Master Agreement (as amended, if applicable) which are incorporated herein by reference as if they had been set out in their entirety.
- e) It is expressly understood by the CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR that this Amendment, until executed by the COUNTY, does not authorize any changes to the cited Work Order and that the COUNTY, prior to its execution of the Amendment, reserves the right to cancel the Amendment without penalty if it is determined that to do so is in the best interest of the COUNTY.
- f) The CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR shall sign the Amendment first and the COUNTY second. This Amendment becomes effective and binding upon execution by the COUNTY and not until then. A copy of this Amendment will be forwarded to the CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR upon execution by the COUNTY.
- g) The CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR may utilize labor categories that are not included in the attached fee proposal, but that have been approved in the Master Agreement. If a substitution is necessary, the work shall be completed within the approved Time Basis (Not-To-Exceed or Limitation of Funds) Work Order Amount, and in no event shall the Work Order Amount be modified as a result of any changes in labor categories. The CONSULTANT/CONTRACTOR shall submit a written request to the County's Project Manager for approval of any substitution prior to the utilization of any labor category for service, and the County Project Manager's approval of any substitution must take place prior to submission of the invoice. Any approved labor category substitution shall be based on the prevailing labor categories and their associated hourly rates established in the Master Agreement that are in effect on the date of the County's approval for any substitution.
- h) FLORIDA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT.
  - Consultant must allow public access to all documents, papers, letters or other material, whether made or received in conjunction with this Work Order which are subject to the public records act, Chapter 119, *Florida Statutes* and as stated in the Master Services Agreement.

Amendment No. 3 to Work Order No. 53 Additional Services to Prepare a Pandemic Plan SCOPE OF SERVICES March 9, 2020

#### PROJECT BACKGROUND

Seminole County Environmental Services Department (SCESD) retained Hazen and Sawyer (Hazen) in 2018 to conduct a vulnerability/risk assessment (RA) for the water and wastewater systems, including treatment facilities. The RAs were completed under existing Work Order No. 53. SCESD needed an updated water and wastewater risk assessment to identify water system threats, critical assets, risks to the system, and mitigation measures to lower risks. Results of the RA are being documented in a report with critical asset summaries and an implementation plan for mitigation measures. Seminole County can integrate this information into their Capital Improvement Plan and policies and procedures.

America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018 (AWIA) was signed in October, 2018 and information about its requirements became available through American Waterworks Association (AWWA) at the start of 2019. The Hazen project team is currently finishing up a final Risk and Resiliency Report (RRR) for SCESD to comply with the first major requirement of the AWIA. In addition, SCESD and the Hazen team conducted a workshop in January 2020 to begin work on the Emergency Response Plan (ERP) which needs to be updated within 6 months of certifying completion of the RRR to comply with the AWIA. The AWIA requires a letter of certification to EPA that the Emergency Response Plan (ERP) for a utility is updated within 6 months of completing a Risk and Resilience Assessment, and at least every 5 years thereafter. Industry practice suggests that revisions be made to an ERP at least yearly because changes in contact information are nearly constant.

Pandemics can occur due to a variety of viruses that impact a global population, most likely in the form of influenza. When a pandemic occurs, an estimated 30% of the world's population will fall ill. In Central Florida, this potentially translates to more than half a million illnesses, tens of thousands requiring hospitalization, and the potential for thousands of deaths within a period of months. The SCESD while limited in the direct response to a pandemic, must organize and plan for potential impacts to staff, resources, and continued operation of critical functions to minimize downtime of essential utilities. Current events with the Corona virus have caused an immediate need for pandemic planning. As such, Launch! Consulting proposes to draft a Pandemic Plan during March 2020, to be used later in conjunction with the SCESD emergency response plan (ERP). The following provides a description of the scope of services:

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

SCESD has requested that Hazen prepare a pandemic plan to supplement the ERP. The ERP is to comply with the AWIA. Hazen will retain the services of a Subconsultant, Launch! Consulting, Inc. (Launch), who specialize in the preparation of pandemic plans.

Hazen will prepare a draft and final Pandemic Plan which is intended to complement the Florida Department of Health Pandemic Response Plan, Seminole County Pandemic Response Plan, and the County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP). The purpose of the Pandemic Plan is to establish a set of standard operating procedures that differ from other emergencies or disasters, including identification of command and control, in order to effectively respond to a wide-spread illness that may impact SCESD. The plan will apply to any SCESD employees, whose responsibility is to ensure that available and applicable protective measures are being implemented to prevent communicability of the illness to other staff. The plan will identify staff responsible for communicating to all employees and government and non-government partners in an effort to aid in a community-based approach to pandemic response. The plan will be approximately 15 pages and will address the following:

- Introduction and Purpose
- Planning Assumptions
- Roles and Responsibilities
  - Devolution of Control
  - o Incident Command Structure
- Communication
  - Internal Communication
  - External Communication
- Pandemic Response
  - o Stage A
  - o Stage B
- Pandemic Recovery

Planning will include up to three phone conference call meetings with SCESD staff. During these meetings, Hazen team staff will ask questions that enable staff to consider needs for pandemic planning and also provide SCESD decisions to include in the plan. One of the conference call meetings will be to review the draft plan and provide changes for the final plan.

#### SUBCONSULTANTS

Launch Consulting, Inc.: HAZEN will utilize the services of a subconsultant (Launch! Consulting, Inc.) to facilitate execution of the work.

#### DELIVERABLES

HAZEN will provide the following information, data, and documents to SCESD:

- Draft Pandemic Plan Report in PDF file format and transmitted using an electronic file transfer website
- Final Pandemic Plan Report in PDF file format and transmitted using an electronic file transfer website

#### SCHEDULE

Work Order No. 53 completion date will be extended until December 31, 2020.

Completion of the draft Pandemic Plan is anticipated to be completed within 30 days of the Notice to Proceed or written authorization of this Amendment No. 3. The final Pandemic Plan is anticipated to be completed within 45 days of the Notice to Proceed or written authorization of this Amendment No. 3.

#### COMPENSATION

HAZEN will be compensated for the scope of services outlined above on a Time & Materials Basis Method. The Not-to-Exceed amount shall be 20,549.08 based on the estimated level of effort shown in Attachment A.
